

Humphrey Fund Scholarship (Description and Directions)

The Award: The Humphrey Fund Scholarship is designed to provide financial grants to South Whidbey High School seniors who have distinguished themselves with contributions to their school and community in addition to achieving academic excellence.

These scholarships are conditioned upon the enrollment of the student in an undergraduate course of study at **Washington State University**. Upon receipt of enrollment notice from the proper college officials, the Humphrey Fund Scholarship will forward a check for the amount of the award directly to the student for credit to his or her account during the first year and during the fourth year of undergraduate study.

The award is open to seniors meeting the general requirements as outlined herein and each award shall consist of two parts to meet the most demanding financial student needs.

For first year of undergraduate study	\$750.00
plus	
For fourth year of undergraduate study	\$750.00

If the recipient chooses not to attend the fourth year of undergraduate study at WSU, the second part of the award, \$750, shall be reserved by the scholarship for future students' awards.

This scholarship fund reflects the personal enjoyment and rewards in achievement of continued education at South Whidbey Schools and at Washington State University of the Humphrey Brothers (Ronald '28, William '34, and John '38).

Eligibility: Any graduating senior at South Whidbey High School planning full-time attendance at Washington State University may apply. A minimum grade point average as an eligibility requirement of 3.2 is desirable, but may be waived by the Board of Trustees for overall criteria requirements.

Selection Criteria: Awards will be based on the following standards:

• Academic Achievement	50 points
• Leadership Potential	20 points
• School / Community Involvement	20 points
• Test Scores	<u>10 points</u>
	100 points TOTAL

Application Requirements: Candidates applying for the Humphrey Fund Scholarship must submit the following to the South Whidbey High School Student Services office:

1. Completed Humphrey Fund application form.
2. A statement of not more than 300 words prepared by the applicant, summarizing the applicant's goals and objectives for higher education and the reason they believe they are qualified for the scholarship.
3. A high school transcript for grades 9 through the first semester of grade 12.
4. One letter of endorsement from a community member not related to the application and not a teacher or staff member at South Whidbey High School, who has had an opportunity to personally observe his or her character, industry, and purposefulness.
5. Copy of acceptance letter from Washington State University.
